A free worksheet to map the real cost of IVF so there are no surprises.



Typical cost ranges (general guidance only — not quotes)

Use these typical national ranges as a starting point, then fill in your own clinic's real numbers.

- IVF clinic fee (one cycle): about \$12,000–\$20,000
- IVF medications (per cycle): about \$3,000–\$7,000
- Fertility testing / workup: about \$250–\$3,000
- Egg or embryo storage (per year): about \$500–\$1,200
- Add-ons (ICSI, genetic testing, anesthesia): varies — ask
